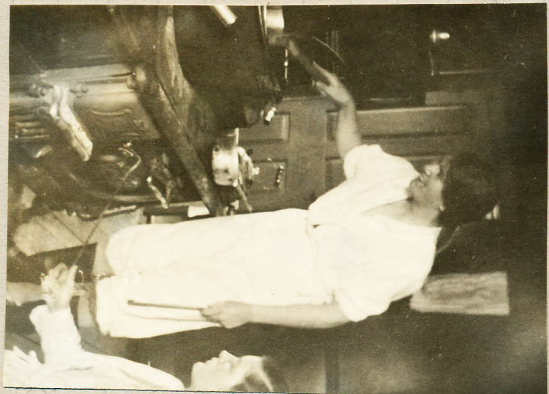




ALICE SMITH - JOHANNSSEN - "Jo"
