Thanks in advance for cooperating.

- 1. <u>Do not give your personal point of view or opinion on what to do if you were testing the prototype</u>
 - a. If a user seems to be doing something particularly atypical, do not correct them, note very carefully what the user is doing
- 2. Do not reveal the goals
 - a. Avoid leading questions and use simple language
 - b. Do not tell the user how to execute the given tasks, but rather the action that they should perform
 - c. Do not affirm or give feedback regarding task execution
- 3. Reassure the user that the system is being evaluated, not them
 - a. Engage the user and ensure he feels comfortable
 - b. Ensure the user understands these are prototypes, not the final design, and they are crucial in helping find flaws
