

However, she didn't have too long to wait before she became thoroughly involved with Jack Saunders. She met him the winter we "came out" at Jane Yule's Deb. Ball held at the Monroes Hunt Club, Jane's bro-ther, Charlie, was a D.U. and so was Jack. Evelyn and I had gone to the Ball without escorts (a really scary bit. I can't think how we braved it, but wasn't it good we did?) and Jack was stag. She married him on July 29th, 1933 at "Awanis". The ceremony was performed by the Rev. Mr. George H. 



cover to Esqui-


mout by night and slept on the ferry: most exciting! Both Evelyn and I did our swim as orderlies to Dr. Boat.




Mention of gray is a reminder of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Peverley crossing










